In August we have continued to focus and execute towards our strategic plan in identifying prospective corporate donors and sponsors while researching and registering for RFPs with grant makers that are aligned with our service mission. We have a meeting in September with a large corporate donor to introduce CLC and seek out partnership opportunities and synergies. Newly Developed Ticket Model for Fundraising Events We have developed a new “Bundled Ticket” Model for special fundraising events. This approach is fresh, simple and will enable CLC to strategically structure and customize our ticket pricing and realize an ROI on the front end before any additional revenue generators are made at, and/or after, an event. The ticket structure will bundle the cost of the event, markup and a donation into one ticket price. Below are examples of customized ticket structures for hypothetical event scenarios:

Scenario 1

- Cost of Event: \$35
- Markup: \$15
- Donation for (1) Child Full Essential Items: \$25

Total Ticket Cost: \$75

In this scenario \$40 would be generated immediately as revenue towards our service mission minus minimal operational event costs. Other revenue generators at an event such as raffles, silent auction, and mystery boxes would be in addition revenue to what would be earned through event ticket sales.

Scenario 2

- Cost of Event: \$35
- Markup: \$15
- Donation for (1) Child Full Essential Items: \$25
- Add +1 Donation Child Full Essential Needs: \$25
- Add +1 Donation Child Full Essential Needs: \$25
- Add +5 Raffle Tickets \$5/ticket

Total Ticket Cost: \$125

In Scenario 2, the ticket purchaser would be given the option to customize their donation in selecting add-ons to how many children they would like to sponsor as well as purchase a selected number of raffle tickets in advance. In this example \$90 would be immediately generated as revenue towards our service mission minus any minimal operational costs. Other revenue generators at an event such as; additional raffle tickets, silent auction and mystery boxes would be in addition revenue to what would be earned through event ticket sales.

Fundraising Events

Marcy McKenney and I have secured 2 fabulous venues for an October 2021 Fall event and also for our 2022 Spring Fundraiser. We are finalizing the contracts on 8/27 with Protagonist Brewery - South End for an October 14, 2021 fundraiser and with The Hyatt Centric South Park on Apex Drive for our March 24, 2022 Spring Fundraiser. We have negotiated excellent pricing structures with them as well as wonderful menu and cocktail selections. I highly encourage you to visit these venues online to see how truly special they are. Hyatt Centric South Park is luxurious and stunning. Protagonist Brewery - South End is a 21,000 square foot brewery that is simply beautiful and elegant. Pasted to the bottom is a rough draft of the digital flyer outlining the details of our Fall Fundraiser at Protagonist Brewery. We would love to have you all attend, participate and invite your friends!! The space accommodates 100 people, and we are striving for a full house. It is going to be loads of fun with delicious gourmet pub food, raffles, beer, wine, specialty cocktails and an education session from the Protagonist Brewmaster. (continued on page 3).



Notes from the Archive:

Centennial Research Committee



Charity League, Inc. opened the Sunshine School in 1928 for elementary aged children in poor health, who could not (continued on page 4)

attend their regular public schools. Why “Sunshine”? Here’s an excerpt from a newspaper article at that time:

“In the treatment of under-developed children there is nothing quite as efficacious as warm sunshine, according to modern medical thought. Sunshine affords powerful remedial properties that no artificial medicine provides, say the doctors. Sunshine, naturally, is good for anyone and sun baths are health-promoting; but for children in the early years, it is even more effective in developing strong young bodies.

It is upon this foundation..... that the Charlotte Charity League’s Sunshine School was established.

Sunshine, of course, is but a part of the curriculum. Other parts are fresh air, good wholesome food, rest, recreation, study. “

Enrollment at the Sunshine School went from 12 pupils to 42 and students stayed at the Sunshine School until they returned to good health and gained 3-5lbs a month. The students were weighed in each day by the school physician and their progress charted. The Sunshine School’s efforts were recognized with the presentation of a silver trophy in 1930, 1931, and won permanently in 1932. The trophy was “Presented by the Mecklenburg County Medical Society to the School with the Greatest Reduction in Underweight”
