Notes from the Archive:

In this section we will highlight information from Charity League history, as compiled by the Centennial Research Committee.

The League was organized in 1921 by Mrs. James L. Staten as the Junior Hospital Auxiliary Guild. Originally, the group consisted of young female members of the Episcopal faith but later other denominations were admitted and the group changed its name to Charity League of Charlotte in 1926. The work of the League was to pay for medical attention, furnishings, fuel, milk and to make layettes for unfortunate babies. In 1927, the League took over operation of the Open Air School for children who were not able to attend public school due to poor health. The school on North Cecil Street, in the rear of Central High School was remodeled with modern plumbing and heating, and a kitchen and dining room were located in the basement, allowing for extra classrooms. The League incorporated as Charity League, Inc. in 1928 and formally opened the Sunshine School on September 29, 1928.
